“NOTIFICATION”

The following amendments to the First Ordinances of the Himachal Pradesh University, as approved by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 14.08.2015 under the powers vested in it under section 40(2) of the Himachal Pradesh University Act-1970 read with Statutes 26(2) of the First Statutes of the University and assented to by the Hon'ble Chancellor under section 40(3) of the Act ibid as conveyed by the Chancellor's office vide letter No.4-37/76-GS-V dated 23.01.2017 are hereby notified for information and necessary action accordingly:-

10 (1) (5)	1.4	Amendment/New Addition 1	<p>In Chapter-I of the Himachal Pradesh University First Ordinances, 1973 (hereinafter referred to as the said Ordinances) in Ordinances 1.4, after Sub-heading, "Faculty of Dental Sciences" of heading, "Minimum Qualifications prescribed for Admission", the following Faculty shall be added, namely:-</p> <p>"Institute of Integrated Himalayan Studies: Department of Interdisciplinary Studies (UGC Centre of Excellence)</p> <p>A. MBA (Rural Development)</p> <p>(i) Minimum qualifications for admission to MBA (Rural Development) shall be Bachelor Degree in any discipline under 10+2+3 pattern of education or its equivalent from any recognized Institute / University with at least 50%(45% in case of SC/ST) marks in aggregate.</p> <p>(ii) The maximum age limit for MBA(Rural Development) is 26 years for boys and 28 years for girl students on 1st July of the year concerned. In case of Scheduled Caste/Tribe, the upper age limit will be raised by three years (for boys and girls): Provided, that the Vice-Chancellor/Presidents of the Institute shall have the power to permit the age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.</p> <p>(iii) The admission to MBA (Rural Development) shall be based on merit as determined by the marks obtained by candidates in their qualifying examinations. However, if the number of applicants is five times the number of seats, the institute will conduct an entrance examination, followed group discussion and personal interview of the candidate conducted by the committee comprising external and internal expert under the chairmanship of Course Coordinator. The entrance test will includes general knowledge and mathematical ability. A brief description and knowledge on rural development would be tested to find out whether the candidate is interested to work in rural areas. The entrance test is the</p>

				<p>first screening stage followed by the group discussion and interview.</p> <p>(iv) Entrance test shall be open to all. It will consist of 100 multiple-choice questions of interdisciplinary nature carrying half mark each. Weightage will be given to the marks at Matriculation, 10+2 level and Graduation, entrance test and personal interview and group discussion will be as follows:-</p> <p>(a) Matriculations: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(b) 10+2: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(c) Graduation: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(d) Entrance Test: marks obtained (out of maximum of 50)</p> <p>(e) Group Discussion:- marks obtained (out of maximum of 10)</p> <p>(f) Personal Interview:- marks obtained (out of maximum of 10)</p> <p>Total maximum marks 100. In case of Scheduled Caste/Tribe, the upper age limit will be raised by three years (for boys and girls.): Provided that the Vice-Chancellor/President of the Institute shall have the power to permit the age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months.</p> <p>(iii) The admission to M.Sc. Environmental Sciences shall be based on merit as determined by the marks obtained by candidates in their qualifying examinations. However, if the number of applicants is five times, the numbers of seats, the Institute will conduct an entrance examination followed by personal interview of the candidate.</p> <p>(iv) The entrance exam would test the scientific aptitude of the students. A brief knowledge of the subject would be tested. The entrance test will consist of 120 multiple-choice question carrying half mark each. Weightage will be given to the marks at matric, 10+2 level and Graduation, entrance test and personal and interview will be as follows:-</p> <p>(a) Matriculation: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(b) 10+2: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(c) Graduation: 10% of the marks obtained</p> <p>(d) Entrance Test: marks obtained (out of maximum of 60)</p> <p>(e) Personal interview: marks obtained</p>

M.A. in Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication - (Hindi Medium)</p> <p>(i) Minimum educational qualification for admission to M.A. in Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication shall be Bachelor Degree in any discipline and its equivalent from any recognized Institute/University with at least 50%(45% in case of SCs and STs marks in aggregate).</p> <p>(ii) The age bar shall be as per University norms and thirty percent (30%) shall be open for Media Persons and Professionals. However, there shall be no age bar for thirty percent seats open for Media Persons and Professionals. The admission to M.A. in Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication shall be based on merit as determined by the marks obtained by the candidates in their qualifying examination.</p> <p>(iii) If the number of applicants is five times the number of seats, the Institute will conduct an entrance examination, followed by group discussion and personal interview of the candidate conducted by the committee comprising external and internal experts under the Chairmanship of Course Coordinator. The entrance test will include general knowledge and knowledge about concerned subject.</p> <p>(iv) The entrance test shall be based upon different aspect of Hindi language up to graduation level, creative language, general knowledge of media, current affairs, and general knowledge of different fields.</p> <p>(v) The whole syllabus examinations as well as entrance test shall be in Medium Hindi.</p> <p>(vi) The Applicant of final year of the graduation shall be allowed to appear in the entrance examination but he shall have to produce the pass certificate of last qualifying exam i.e. graduation in any stream.</p> <p>D. Number of attempts for examination has been waived off. There shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is as prescribed for each Nursing Programme i.e. B.Sc. (Nursing) 8 years. However, all papers need to be cleared before appearing in the final examinations. To be eligible to appear for annual examinations candidates must have 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and Practical in each subject for appearing in examinations. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of practical areas before award of degree. A candidate having re-appear in one or two subjects in first year shall be promoted to the second year till the supplementary examination.
